CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

DUE: Friday, February 26, 2016

Submissions MUST be complete and include the following:

- (1) Applicant(s) Contact Information: Name(s), Phone Number(s), Email Address(s), and Mailing Address(es).
- (2) Abstract Cover Sheet, which includes the title of the proposed presentation with authors. Please also indicate if you are submitting for a poster or paper presentation
- (3) A 250 maximum word abstract formatted consistent with APA guidelines. Please do not include any identifying information in the abstract.

The Association of Black Psychologists Student Circle will be accepting both poster and paper presentation applications. The symposium focuses on the presentation of the author's/authors' research study or paper and theory while gaining consultation from other peers to strengthen their research. In addition, participants will be expected to address any questions that may be posed by their audience.

It is <u>strongly recommended</u> that applicants address some aspect of the convention theme: "Unafraid to Matter."

Submissions will be rated by a joint student member-professional member panel. Please note that paper presentation submissions may be considered for poster presentations, based on availability of slots. Presenters will be notified in this case
